

Score Clock Quick Fact Sheet

Before the Game Begins

- Game number must be written in the top left corner
- Score keeper's name and phone number must be written in the top right corner
- Length of the game (each division is given set times) in the top right corner
- Start and end times written in the bottom right corner
- Both teams must initial the curfew time in the top right corner
- Names of all players and their #s and Cs and As must be clearly written
- Coaching staff and all certification #s must be listed (you must have a certified trainer on the bench for each game)

During the Game

- every penalty must be written on its own line along with goals and assists, don't forget the player #
- if a player receives 3 stick infractions during a game they will be ejected (rep) - you must monitor this
- if a player receives 3 penalties during a game they will be ejected (house league) - you must monitor this
- coincidental penalties are marked on the game sheet but are not put on the score clock. You can place an * beside this penalty so that you remember when the players can return to the ice.
- If there are 2 penalties on the clock and a 3rd is called, the 3rd penalty cannot start until the 1st penalty finishes. The finished penalty will not be able to go on the ice from the box until the whistle or the team will face a 'too many men' penalty
- 10 minute misconducts - gross, game etc. do not go on the clock
- 5 minute major penalties are served first and then any 2 minute minor penalties that this player has can be served. A 2 minute, 5 minute major, 10 misconducts and GAs need to be written on the game sheet but the 10 minute penalties will not appear on the clock
- No time is put on the game sheet for a game ejection
- Off time, start time and on time must be filled in for each penalty. Sometimes the off time and start time are different as in the case of the 3rd penalty.
